ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION IN BA/B.SC./B.COM 1ST SEMESTER AS PER NEP GUIDELINES--2020

Age: An applicant must not be more than 23 years (25 years for girls) of age as on First July of 2026 and must not have been born earlier 01.07.2003. However, in case of overage candidates, the Vice-Chancellor may allow age relaxation up to six months. In case of Scheduled Caste/Scheduled Tribe students, relaxation in age up to three years. as per rules.

Marks: A student who has passed 10+2 examination or an equivalent course can get admission in the first year of the three-year degree course if he/she fulfils the eligibility conditions.

- i.** 33% of marks in 10+2 examination for applicant seeking admission in B.A. 1st Year provided he has passed English as subject in 10+2 level. For candidates opting for Mathematics as one of the subjects of study, percentage should either be 45% marks in aggregate or 45% marks in Mathematics at +2 level.
- ii.** 45% marks in 10+2 examination or an examination equivalent thereto of a Board/ University established by law in India with pass in four written subjects (three Science elective subjects & one English) for applicant seeking admission in Bachelor of Science (Pass Course).
- iii.** For applicant seeking admission in B. Com. 1st year, eligibility is 40% marks for those who have passed 10+2 from Commerce stream.
However, it is 45% for other students provided they have studied Mathematics/Economics as compulsory subjects at 10+2 level. It is 33% for Girl students.
- iv.** If a candidate does not produce the actual marks certificate from a University/Board in respect of +2 examinations or equivalent examination where the result is shown in grades and standards etc. the minimum percentage of marks for each subject given in standards will be taken into consideration for determining their eligibility.
- v.** A relaxation of 5% marks is given for SC/ST candidates seeking admission in B.Sc/B.Com. stream.
- vi.** An applicant having compartment in 10+2 will not be admitted.

ADMISSION RULES/DOCUMENTS REQUIRED:

There are some general guidelines that need to be followed in order to pursue a B.A./B.Sc./B.Com. First year of bachelor degree. The general guidelines to be followed:

- 1.** Admission will be strictly on fulfilment of **eligibility conditions (as given above)**.
- 2.** Application form must be complete in all respects along with the following **documents**:
 - (a) Self-attested copy of the detailed **marks certificate of the 10+2 examination**
 - (b) Original **Character Certificate from the institution last attended**.
 - (c) **Self-attested** copy of Matriculation certificate/date of birth certificate.
 - (d) **Two passport-size** photographs (one pasted on **the library** card and another on the admission form)
 - (e) A passport-size **photograph of the parents** to be affixed on **the PTA** membership form
 - (f) A photocopy of **Aadhaar card (self-attested)**.
 - (g) To avail a concession in tuition fee, **Girl students must bring an attested copy of H.P. bona fide Certificate**.
 - (h) Candidates, coming from Boards/Universities other than the HP Board of School Education / HPU Shimla, must produce a **migration certificate in original**. Those who have passed the first year/ second year of a degree course from other than H.P. University will have to produce an Equivalence Certificate from the Himachal Pradesh University.
- 3.** Applicants must attach documentary **proof for SC/ST/OBC/IRDP/BPL/physically challenged and sports and cultural activities participation**.
- 4.** A student must produce original certificates whenever asked to do so.

Important Points:

- Rules for admission are subject to change as per HPU notifications from time to time.
- Admission of a student is liable to be cancelled if he/she furnishes incomplete /wrong /false information or in case of concealment of facts. Disciplinary action will also be taken against such candidates.
- Notwithstanding eligibility for admission, the Principal can refuse admission if the conduct of any student has not been up to the mark during past years.
- Initially, all the admissions will be provisional (i.e. subject to approval by H.P. University).
- A student can migrate from one college to another in accordance with the rules laid down by the H.P. University. However, such students must obtain the approval of the concerned Admission Committee.
- Students seeking exemption from tuition fee for disability must attach an attested copy of 40% disability certificate.
- The Principal reserves the right to allow, disallow or cancel any admission at any stage.
- Candidate seeking admission for the first time in this college must be accompanied by his/her parents/guardians to the admission committee.
- Any gap in the academic career of an applicant must be supported by documentary evidence and a self-undertaking.

**As this scheme is being implemented for the first time, it shall remain subject to modifications in accordance with the guidelines and instructions issued by HPU/ the Govt. of HP.*

NEP 2020:

Introduction:

The Govt of Himachal Pradesh has decided to implement NEP 2020 from the session 2026-2027.

NEP 2020, or the National Education Policy 2020, is a comprehensive policy introduced by the Government of India to transform the education system in the country. It aims to bring about significant changes in various aspects of education, from school to higher education.

Salient Features of NEP 2020:

The National Education Policy 2020 (NEP2020) in India brings several significant changes compared to the prevalent education policy at the time of its introduction. Here are some key differences between the prevalent education policy and NEP2020:

- **Multidisciplinary Approach:** NEP2020 promotes a multidisciplinary approach to education, encouraging students to choose subjects across different disciplines and bridging the gap between arts, sciences, and humanities.
- **Reduction in Content Overload:** NEP2020 emphasizes on the reduction of content overload in the curriculum to focus on core concepts and critical thinking rather than rote memorization.

- **Skill Development and Vocational Education:** NEP2020 places significant importance on skill development and vocational education, aiming to provide students with practical skills and promote entrepreneurship.
- **Assessment Reforms:** NEP2020 advocates for a shift in assessment methods, aiming to move away from high-stakes examinations and focus on a more comprehensive and holistic assessment of student understanding and skills.
- **Inclusion and Equity:** NEP2020 emphasizes inclusion and equity in education, aiming to address gender and social disparities, provide equal opportunities for marginalized communities, and promote inclusive education for students with disabilities.
- **Research and Innovation:** NEP2020 recognizes the importance of research and innovation in education, encouraging the establishment of research centers and promoting a culture of research among students and teachers.
- **Internationalization:** NEP2020 recognizes the significance of internationalization in education. It encourages collaborations and exchange programs between Indian and foreign institutions, promoting global exposure and cross-cultural learning.

Curriculum and Credit Framework for Undergraduate Programmes:

Core Subject: A single subject course of study pursued by a student as a mandatory requirement of the programme of study. The Indian knowledge system (IKS) is to be included in the core courses. It will be a subject of personal choice, and it will be studied throughout the three-year degree programme. It can be any subject from the subjects studied in school. A student can take up any core subject right now and can go on to pursue Master's level and doctoral studies from this standpoint. The major discipline is the discipline or subject of main focus, and the degree will be awarded in that discipline. Students should secure the prescribed number of credits (about 50% of total credits) through core courses in the major discipline.

Minor Subject: A second subject of study pursued by a student as an additional requirement of the programme of study. Minor discipline helps a student to gain a broader understanding beyond the major discipline. For example, if a student pursuing an Economics major obtains a minimum of 12 credits from a bunch of courses in Statistics, then the student will be awarded a B.A. degree in Economics with a Minor in Statistics.

Multi-disciplinary Course (MDC): A subject other than the ones opted for Major and Minor, and the student is free to choose from a whole range of subjects, designed to develop his cognitive capacities.

Ability Enhancement Course (AEC): Mandatory Courses on content related to Language and Literature (i) Compulsory--English and Hindi communication.

Skill Enhancement Course (SEC): Courses aimed at imparting practical skills, hands-on training, and soft skills to increase students' employability. It could be chosen from a basket/pool offered by the college or a MOOC on *Swayam* or NPTEL platforms.

I/A/P/C: Internship/Apprenticeship/Project/Community outreach--Application of knowledge/concepts in solving or analyzing a real-life problem. All these are related to the major subject.

VAC: Value Addition Course--Compulsory courses on (i) The Constitution of India and (ii) Environmental Education. The tables below contain the planned quantum of courses that will be offered under the Arts, Science, and Commerce (grant-in-aid) programmes starting from June 2026.

UG Certificate: Students who opt to exit after completion of the first year and have secured 40 credits will be awarded a UG certificate if, in addition, they complete an additional course of 4 credits during the summer vacation of the first year (**Total=44 Credits**). These students are allowed to re-enter the degree programme within three years and complete the degree programme within the stipulated maximum period of seven years.

UG Diploma: Students who opt to exit after completion of the second year and have secured 80 credits will be awarded the UG diploma if, in addition, they complete one vocational course of 4 credits during the summer vacation of the second year (**Total=86 Credits**). These students are allowed to re-enter within a period of three years and complete the degree programme within the maximum period of seven years.

3-year UG Degree: Students who wish to undergo a 3-year UG programme will be awarded a UG Degree in the Major discipline after successful completion of three years, securing 120 credits plus 8 credits (**Total=128 Credits**) and satisfying the minimum credit requirement.

ABC ID:

The HPU-UGP is directly connected to the Academic Bank of Credit (ABC) as notified by the UGC. All credits a student earns at the end of an examination in HPU-UGP will be deposited in the ABC by the university. As such, a student under HPU-UGP must register for the ABC as notified by the regulatory agencies. The Academic Bank of Credit (ABC) is proposed by the NEP where higher educational institutions will digitally deposit not money but credits earned by a student for the course they studied. Students can opt for a three-year Hons programme, a four-year Hons programme or a four-year Hons programme with research. They can also exit/enter at any level with appropriate certification. The ABC is expected to aid the multiple entries and exit system **as well as** the multidisciplinary in higher education.

Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) for 2nd and 3rd Year

Documents required for Admission to B.A./B.Com./B.Sc. 2nd and 3rd year:

1. Fee receipt of the second installment of fees paid in the first/second year.
2. Admit card of the last annual examination.
3. Character Certificate in case of migrating students.

ADMISSION THROUGH MIGRATION:

Inter-Institutional migration (including from one college to another as well as from a college to the ICDEOL and vice versa) of students will be allowed when no-objection certificate is obtained from both the relieving and receiving institutions, signed by their respective Principals/Directors to ascertain especially that the major/minor/discipline specific course/elective courses being studied by the migrating student are available in the receiving institution. The procedure for migration is as follow:

- I.** A student seeking migration to the MSCM Govt College, Thural shall be permitted only if seats are available in the concerned subject and subject combination offered by the college.
- II.** A student seeking migration must obtain the consent of the teachers and the Principal of both the parent college and the college to which he/she intends to migrate, on the prescribed proforma.
- III.** If permission is granted, the University shall issue two No-Objection Certificates—one for the parent college and the other for the college to which the student seeks migration. The migrating student is required to submit the following documents along with the Migration Certificate:
 - a) Lecture attendance of the subjects.
 - b) Statement of credit earned under CCA.
 - c) Original Character Certificate from the Principal of the college last attended.
 - d) Admission will be given during the time period provided by the H.P. University.
 - e) A student migrating to the MSCM Govt. College, Thural shall be required to pay the admission fee afresh; however, the monthly fee shall be charged only from the month of joining the college.

All the conditions and requirements for the degree, including the time frame, will remain as given above and in the other clauses of the regulations.

Internal Assessment (BA/BCom II & III Year)

Internal Assessment for undergraduate classes will be of 30 marks in each theory paper based on the following criteria:

1. *House Exam: 15 marks*
2. *Two Assignments: 10 marks*
3. *Attendance: 05 marks*

Those having greater than 75% attendance will be awarded CCE marks as follows:

- >75% but <80%= 1 mark
- >80% but <85%= 2 marks
- >85% but <90%= 3 marks
- >90% but <95%= 4 marks
- >95% but <100%= 5 marks

NOTE: End-term Examination (ETE)--accounting for the remaining 70% of the final grade that a student gets in a course.

An outline of the course:

Admission to the 2nd and 3rd year of bachelor's degree (B.A./B.Sc./B.Com.) will be according to the choice-based credit system (CBCS). The main feature of the **choice-based** system (CBCS) is to make Undergraduate courses **student-centric rather than system-centric or teacher-centric**. In order to achieve this objective, the CBCS strives to create a holistic syllabus. It comprises of the following three courses:

- **Core Course.**
- **Elective Course.**
- **Skill Enhancement Course.**

Core Course refers to a course that should compulsorily be studied by a candidate as a core requirement, and disciplinary compulsion is termed as a Core course. Additionally, to focus on a discipline through core papers in **the general** curriculum, **elective papers** have been introduced that will provide students the freedom to choose the allied/applied/broad areas of their discipline. : A single subject course of study pursued by a student as a mandatory requirement of the programme of study. The Indian knowledge system (IKS) is to be included in the core courses. It will be a subject of personal choice, and it will be studied throughout the three-year degree programme. It can be any subject from the subjects studied in school. A student can take up any major subject right now and can go on to pursue Master's level and doctoral studies from this standpoint. The number of Core Papers for a General Programme in Science (B.Sc.) shall be 12 and for General Programme in Arts (B.A.) & Commerce (B.Com.) shall have 12 Core Courses each. Besides, there will be 2 papers each of English and Hindi/MIL in B.A./B.Com. as Compulsory Courses. The course designed for papers under this category aims to cover the basics that a student is expected to imbibe in that particular discipline.

Elective Course: It is generally a course that can be chosen from a variety of courses. These may be very specific, specialized, advanced and supportive to the discipline/ subject of study. An elective course is one that provides an extended scope and enables exposure to some other discipline/subject/domain. These overall nurtures the candidate's proficiency/skill and is called the Elective Course.

Discipline Specific Elective Course (2 each for regular courses): Elective courses offered under the main discipline/subject of study are referred to as Discipline Specific Elective.

Generic Elective (GE) Course (2 courses each for B.A./B.Com. regular courses): An elective course chosen from an unrelated discipline/subject, with an intention to seek exposure beyond discipline/s of choice, is called a Generic Elective. The purpose of this category of papers is to offer the students the option to explore disciplines of interest beyond the choices they make in Core and Discipline Specific Elective papers.

Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC): SEC courses are value-based and/or skill-based courses and are aimed at providing hands-on training, competencies, skills, etc. These courses may be chosen from a pool of courses designed to provide value-based and/or skill-based knowledge and should contain both theory and lab/hands-on/training/field work. The main purpose of these courses is to provide students with life skills in a hands-on mode so as to increase their employability.

An undergraduate degree in Science disciplines may be awarded if a student completes 4 core courses each in three disciplines of choice, 2 Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses, a minimum of 4 Skill Enhancement Courses and 2 papers each from a list of Discipline Specific Elective papers based on the three disciplines of choice selected above, respectively.

An Undergraduate degree in Humanities/ Social Sciences/ Commerce may be awarded if a student completes 4 core papers each in two disciplines of choice, 2 compulsory core papers each in English and Hindi/MIL, respectively, 2 Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC), minimum 4 Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC), 2 papers each from a list of Discipline Specific Elective papers based on the two disciplines of choice selected above, respectively, and two papers from the list of Generic Electives papers.

So, the CBCS provides an opportunity for the students to choose courses from the prescribed courses comprising core, elective and skill-based courses. These courses can be evaluated following the grading system. This will benefit the students to move across institutions both within India and across countries. In order to bring uniformity in the evaluation system, the computation of the Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) is based on students' performance in examinations as per the UGC formulated guidelines. However, in keeping with the spirit of CBCS, the students will have complete freedom to choose these courses from a group suggested by the UGC/University.

Anti-Ragging Rules:

To ensure zero tolerance towards ragging and its complete eradication from educational institutions, the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India, through its orders dated 4 May 2007 and 11 February 2009, has issued the following directions:

- Ragging is strictly prohibited in the institution.
- Anyone indulging in ragging is liable to be punished appropriately. Punishment shall be exemplary and **justifiably** harsh.

➤ **Punishment for ragging includes:**

- Imprisonment/fine or both.
- Expulsion from the institution, suspension from the institution or classes for a limited period and **a fine** with a public apology.
- Withholding scholarships or other benefits.
- Debarring from representation in events.
- Withholding of result.
- In case the applicant for admission is found to have indulged in ragging/**indiscipline in the** past or if **it is** noticed later that **he/she** has indulged in ragging, admission shall be refused to him/her, or he/she shall be expelled from the institution forthwith.

Definition of Ragging:

Ragging means any act, conduct or practice by dominant power of senior students, former **students, or** outsiders brought to bear on the students freshly enrolled or students who are in any way considered junior by other students and includes individuals or collective acts **or practices** which:

- Involves physical or psychological assault or threat or use of force or wrongful confinement or restraint or **violates the status**, dignity, and honor of such students.
- Exposes students to ridicule and contempt and **affects** their self-esteem or entails verbal abuse and aggression, indecent gestures, and obscene behavior.

Prohibition of Ragging:

- No person shall practice in any form within or outside the premises **of the college**.
- Any person who violates or contravenes the provision of **the Anti-Ragging Act** shall, on **conviction**, be punished with imprisonment for a term which may extend up to 3years or with a fine which may extend to 50000 Rupees or with both.
- Teasing girls' students in any manner is an offence and is punishable under the law. Hence, students are advised to refrain from such activities, otherwise they would face strict legal action.

The Rules of the Library:

- Students are expected to make the maximum use of the **library facilities** during their free periods.
- Only two books shall be issued at a time for a period of 14 days. If the issued book(s) **are not returned or reissued in time, a fine** will be charged per book, per day.
- Reference books will not be issued.
- In case of a loss or damage of an issued book, it will either **be replaced or** its payment of the present cost will be accepted only with the permission **of the Principal**.

Library card

An identity card is an important document as it shows the identity of a *bona fide* student. Identity cum library card should be collected from the college library as per **the schedule** prescribed by the Librarian. Each student must carry this card while in the college. In case of loss of the identity card, **a duplicate** identity card will be issued after producing the FIR in this context. **For a duplicate** identity card, **Rs. 20** will be charged. Students are not permitted to replace his/her photograph pasted on the identity card for any reason whatsoever.

Students must carry their **ID card** along with them; anyone found without an **ID card** will be fined **Rs. 50/-**.

Leave Rules:

- No student is supposed to be absent without getting his/her leave sanctioned by the course teacher.
- Leave **of up to 06** days shall be sanctioned by the concerned subject teacher.
- Leave for more than six days shall be sanctioned by the Principal.
- The student will be marked **on leave during** the leave **period, and** the same will not be considered for calculating the lecture attendance for determining eligibility to appear in the University exam.
- Students who are officially deputed to participate in NSS / Sports and extra-curricular activities of the H.P. University Youth Festival/Championships are treated on leave **or for** the purpose of attendance, provided that Prior permission has been sought from the Principal in this matter and its note has been made by the subject teacher in the attendance register.
- No leave will be granted during the Midterm Examination.

- It is the personal responsibility of each student to get his/her name entered in the attendance register of each concerned subject teacher. If he/she fails to do so, he/she will be treated as absent.

Name Struck-off and Re-Admission:

- If a student remains absent continuously for **06 days** without sanctioned leave, their name will be **struck off** from the college rolls as per the rules. Re-admission can only be granted upon the recommendation of the concerned subject teacher.
- Re-admission is allowed within the next **06 days** by **paying the re-admission** fee and **Absence fine** as per college rules, subject to the approval of the **Principal**.
- **The re-admission fee** is ₹100 for the first instance and ₹200 for the second instance.
- **No re-admission will be allowed for the third time.**
- Character and migration certificates issued by the institution shall include, in addition to general conduct and behavior, a specific entry stating whether the student was involved in ragging and whether they were punished for it.
- If an applicant is found to have indulged in **ragging** or **indiscipline** in the past, or if such behavior is discovered later, **admission may be refused**, or the student may be **expelled from the institution immediately**.
